## 2010 ORCHID SHOW

### REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. Notice of intent to exhibit must be received by March 3, 2010. It should be sent to James Yamber, 380 Western Ave., Oakdale, PA 15071, or emailed to him at quail1@verizon.net. Reasonable effort will be made to provide the space requested, but should it be necessary, the Show Committee reserves the right to limit the space allocated to any and all exhibitors.
2. The OSWP will furnish 6' high exhibit space dividers and background in place. Exhibits should not extend above the backdrop. Nothing may be hung from the backdrops. Exhibitors must provide all other staging materials. An exhibit is a composition of plants arranged to their best advantage to contribute to the general beauty of the show. While there is no minimum number of plants, the materials must fill the space in an artistic manner and orchids must predominate. The theme of this show is "The Mystique of Orchids."
3. No cut orchid flowers will be permitted in a flowering plant exhibit, and no flowering plants will be permitted in a cut flower exhibit. No plants in flower other than orchids will be permitted in any exhibit.
4. Single plants will be accepted for exhibition and judging.
5. Exhibit classes are open to everyone except as otherwise noted in these Registration Instructions. All plants entered for Amateur judging must have been in the possession of the exhibitor on or before December 18, 2009. Amateurs may enter plants purchased on or after December 19, 2009 for Open judging.
6. An Amateur is defined as a person who sells no more than 100 orchid plants per year and is not a professional horticulturist.
7. A Novice is defined as an Amateur who has never won a blue ribbon in any orchid show. A Novice may enter a maximum of two plants in their proper class as well as the class 180 - NOVICE PLANTS - species & hybrids.
8. Anyone selling plants from an area other than the OSWP's sales table must exhibit in the Open Division.
9. Exhibits may be set up from 8:30 AM to 11:00 PM on Thursday, March 18, 2010 and from 8:00 AM to 11:00 AM on Friday, March 19, 2010. All plants and exhibits must be ready for judging by Noon, Friday, March 19, 2010.
10. Registration of plant and exhibit entries for judging will be from 1:00 PM to 10:00 PM on Thursday March 18, 2010.
11. **All plants must be entered in the lowest numbered applicable class.** Plants may be entered in only a single class, except for class 180 – NOVICE PLANTS – species & hybrids. **Please ask for help at Registration if you are not sure in which class to enter a plant.**
12. Species classes include natural hybrids.
13. All plants to be judged must be labeled by the exhibitor as to genus and species or hybrid name. Entry forms **must** identify mericlones, awarded plants, and parentage.
14. An intrageneric hybrid has parents from more than one species but only one genus. An intergeneric hybrid has parents from more than one genus.
15. Judges will have the right to award or withhold any scheduled trophy or ribbon, and may subdivide any plant class when warranted. First, second and third place ribbons will be awarded for each class of plants and exhibits when considered merited by the judges.
16. Ribbons and trophies will be awarded, when merited, separately for Amateur and Open plants and exhibits, unless otherwise indicated by these Registration Instructions. **Yellow entry forms must be used to enter a plant or exhibit for Amateur judging. White entry forms must be used to enter a plant or exhibit for Open judging.**
17. Unless clearly designated otherwise, every exhibited plant will be eligible for AOS awards, and exhibitors agree to complete AOS requirements for awarded plants.
18. An entry form must be completed for each exhibit to be judged.
19. Entry tags should be removed from the exhibits and plants after judging no later than 7:00 PM on Friday, March 19, 2010.
20. Hours for viewing the show will be:

Saturday March 20, 2010 10:00 AM to 6:00 PM

Sunday March 21, 2010 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM

21. Neither the Orchid Society of Western Pennsylvania, Inc., nor the Phipps Garden Center is responsible for the loss or damage to any plant, bloom, container, or other property of the exhibitor. However, precautions will be exercised for their safety.
22. All entries and displays must be left in place until 5:00 PM, Sunday, March 21, 2010. Entries and displays not removed by 7:00 PM, Sunday, March 21, 2010, will be disposed of by the Show Committee.
23. All questions regarding the interpretation or application of these Registration Instructions shall be referred to the Registrar. The Registrar's decision will be final.

AOS Show Trophy: The most outstanding exhibit of orchid plants in flower, arranged for effect. (One trophy only)

Orchid Digest Corporation Show Trophy: Amateur exhibit, 25 square feet and over, showing high plant quality and excellent culture. (One trophy only)

People's Choice Award: To the exhibit judged by the visiting public as the best exhibit of the show. (One trophy only)

Best Exhibits: Orchid plants in flower arranged for effect.

Best Exhibit (50 or more sq. feet): Class 1

Best Exhibit (25 square feet): Class 2

Best Table Top Exhibit: Class 3 (Amateur only)

Best Society Exhibit: Best of Classes 4 & 5
