### May Featured Guest - Russ Vernon



**Presentation:** Sex in the World of Orchids is an orchid sex talk...orchid pollination. Russ came to our show as a vendor for many years.

The program entails the considerations a hybridizer would ponder when choosing the various aspects of each parent and how they might contribute to the ultimate end result. Cattleya, Phalaenopsis and Odontoglossum (Oncidium) will be the subjects of the talk. A little "how to" will be included as well as why do it at all? Russ will bring plants for sale so there is **NO member sales** 

**Biography:** Russ grew up in Cleveland, Ohio. Early on he had an interest in plants, helping in the yard and growing cacti purchased with his allowance. His parents and grandparents were all interested in various aspects of horticulture.

When Russ was 12 years old, his uncle arrived with 6 orchids saying, "If you can grow those darned cacti, you ought to be able to grow these." And a career was launched.

Russ is a graduate of Ohio State University majoring in horticulture/floriculture. He has worked for Orchid by Hausermann, A&P Orchids, Ball State University's Wheeler Orchid Collection and Species Bank, and Jim Davis, the creator of Garfield the Cat.

In 2004, Russ and his wife Anita started New Vision Orchids. The company specializes in Phalaenopsis, Odontoglossums and their intergenerics, Miltoniopsis, Cattleyas, and Lycastes. The biggest area of focus is hybridizing, wholesale and retail sales. Russ also lectures to various orchid societies across the country and conducts workshops on orchid culture.

Russ is a judge of the American Orchid Society and is past President of the International Phalaenopsis Alliance, and Past President of the Mid-America Orchid Congress and serves on their Conservation Committee. Russ has also served on the board of trustees of the American Orchid Society. He and Anita have two daughters.



### Regular Meeting of OSWP

Nancy Kline presented a mini-class on preparing to move orchids outside for the summer.

### **Business**

The business portion of the general membership meeting was called to order at approx. 2:00 pm by Co-Presidents Gary VanGelder and Demetria Marsh. New members were recognized.

Demetria advised the members of the passing of Arlene Ricker.

### **Committee Reports:**

Treasurer's Report: Janet Greenburg presented the Treasurer's Report. Janet also noted the need for an Assistant Treasurer. She is looking for someone who is familiar with QuickBooks and, in particular, Excel. Janetg150@verizon.net

Membership: Kathy Collins noted that 103 members (individual and family) joined at the Show. Following the Show, a total of 128 nametags were prepared. OSWP has now reached a milestone – OSWP now has 400 members.

Secretary: Kathy noted that preparation of Thank You letters to vendors is in process.

Show Chairs: Kathy McCafferty, Mary Ann Pike and Lawrene Neel thanked all the volunteers who participated. They noted that they have requested feedback from all the Committee Chairs. They are in the process of preparing a report on the Show which they hope to have available at the May meeting.

AOS/Culture Corner: Nancy encouraged members to consider joining and supporting the American Orchid Society (AOS). She also remains available to members who have questions about their particular orchids.
