

As we prepare for another OSWP Orchid Show, it is time to refresh or learn the skills of creating your very own or combined Orchid Display.




1. Bring your orchids for show & tell, such as this famous Cymbidium to your left.




WE ARE NOW MEMBERS OF THE MAOC!







Carolyn Bolton and The OSWP Show Exhibit: What is it? Why should we care?

One of the great pleasures of attending our show is being able to view a huge variety of colorful orchids that are eyecatching, artistically arranged, and create a sense of wonder.

Show displays include those arranged by individual(s), vendor exhibits, and Society Exhibits. All are expected to conform to a set of AOS standards – and yet to show creativity, imagination, artistic use of color, and to take our breath away.

Society exhibits consist of a display of plants that members are growing. Choosing which ones to include, making sure that expected conditions are met, and seeing that the ultimate product is artistically lovely falls to the Show Exhibit leader, Carolyn Bolton.

Carolyn, how did you get started?

I have been arranging exhibits since the late 80's and 90's. It seemed like a nice way to show off the plants that I grew. I partnered with another member, then did my own exhibit, then ended up working with Barbara Tisherman (a long time OSWP member, AOS judge, and winner of many awarded plants) who was an extremely good teacher. I learned by watching what she did, how she arranged the plants and grouped by color, and so on. I've been in charge of the OSWP Society exhibit for the past 4-5 years.



I've learned a lot. For example, it's a group project and can take a really long time to assemble. And often you don't know what members are going to bring in. So we struggle with balancing the need for displaying a variety of orchids, screening some plants out, and being flexible enough to include a last minute show-up that is too good to ignore even though we may have to rearrange the plant groupings. Sometimes members will also bring over noteworthy plants that they cannot use in their own exhibits.

There's a whole lot of rules about accessories. One is that that the focus remains on the orchids. We therefore use black fabric to hide the pots and to drape over the exhibit's structural elements where appropriate. To make the process easier we try to cover all the plant pots beforehand and we ask participants to send us a list of plants they expect to bring in so that we can create individual labels. Another dilemma involves decorative items: in or out? In the past I used a large green plant in my display until I overhead the judges criticize it because it diverted attention from the orchids.

We're also selective. Obviously we screen out plants that show bugs or signs of virus, or which are disfigured or only have minimal blooms (although this varies with the type of specific plant or hybrid). And if they meet all our criteria but we are out of space or for other reasons, we display them in the designated plant Overflow Area so that they can still be judged and awarded ribbons.

And once things are preliminarily positioned, our volunteers stand back and take the time to discuss which might be better displayed, whether the colors flow, and where we should leave a "quiet space" so that the eye is not overwhelmed.

Why should members sign up to help?

If you're looking for pragmatic knowledge, sign up! You don't need prior experience. And your hands-on learning promotes appreciation of the other displays. Exhibits follow certain rules, similar to those governing flower arranging. Finally, you not only gain firsthand knowledge but you also get to mingle with fellow OSWP members. So it's both a friend maker and a knowledge builder.

Hopefully this experience will also encourage you to consider building your own exhibit. You only need 4-5 blooming plants – and you can always borrow them from others.

And how successful have the exhibits been?


The OSWP exhibits have a truly remarkable track record. We have been repeatedly awarded the AOS Show Trophy and the Orchid Digest trophy.

And it's a big deal! The Awards Quarterly describes the AOS Show Trophy as "the most prestigious trophy awarded on a regular basis by the American Orchid Society's judging system. Its... kind of like having the Oscar, Emmy and Tony Awards, all wrapped up into one."

We also travel to other Society shows, such as those in Akron and West Shore, Ohio. It's a way of showing off – and to also know that other societies will reciprocate by coming here as well.


Final words.



OSWP Orchid Society of Western Pennsylvania (OSWP) General Meeting Jan. 21, 2024

The meeting was held at The Spartan Community Center of Hazelwood.

A mini-class presented by Carol Panza regarding the optimal time for repotting catasetinae (Freclarkeara, catasetum, clowesetum and cycnoches) orchids.


The business portion of the general membership meeting was called to order at approx. 2:00 pm by President Dave Panasiuk.

The meeting began with an advisement to the membership that the OSWP Board has voted to approve OSWP's membership in the Mid America Orchid Congress for a one year introductory rate of \$45. (Future year membership will be considered after this trial membership as the regular annual rate is significantly higher for groups.) This initial membership was triggered by our desire to participate in a Phragmedium presentation that will be taped and provided to the OSWP membership via email once the link becomes available. Watch for an email blast. Carol Panza will be our representative to this group.

The Nominating Committee of Sheila Nathanson, Norma Raiff and Jim Yamber is currently active and looking for nominees for all Officer positions and Board members. Norma advised that (other than Zander Morrison) the entire slate of officers and board members is open for the coming year. Consideration is being given to revising the OSWP Bylaws to change the terms of office to 3 years from 2, and to stagger the terms so that not all positions will be open in the same year. As required by the OSWP Bylaws, the required 60 day notice of intent to revise the Bylaws was made at this Jan. 21, 2024 meeting. Candidates will be presented at the April meeting.

Update from the Spring Show Committee (Sheila Nathanson, Norma Raiff and Janet Greenberg) regarding the preparations for the 2024 Spring Show.

- Due to family issues, Demetria Marsh is unable to Chair the Publicity Committee and the Chair position is vacant. Anyone with contacts at the PG or Tribune who can assist in getting an article about the show placed in one of these papers is asked to contact a member of the Show Committee,
- Tamara Wurst has agreed to Co-Chair the Helpers Committee. An additional Co-Chair for the Helpers is needed.
- Brian Powell completed work on branding handouts that include the new OSWP logo and were available at the meeting. (Thank you, Brian they are beautiful!)
- Members are encouraged to consider who they might be able to contact for sponsorship opportunities.
- Sign-Up Genius is now active on-line for OSWP members to sign up for volunteer slots to assist at the Show.

A number of members presented orchids they had brought to the meeting for the purpose of Show & Tell.


