"Today's Mini and Compact Cattleya's"

Today Mini and Compact growing Cattleya's come in many colors and shapes. Learn about the small growing Cattleya species, the important breeding plants and what hybrids are available for the orchid enthusiast. In conclusion we cover the 'best growing practices' for cultivations these little gems.


The presenter will be Fred Clarke of Sunset Valley Orchids in Vista. Fred Clarke has been growing orchids for 42 years and has been hybridizing for 38 of those years. With over 34 years as a professional grower and manager in the horticultural industry, Fred applies these skills at his orchid nursery; Sunset Valley Orchids, located in San Diego, California.

He is a passionate orchid grower whose curiosity in orchids is broad and varied. Although developing Cattleya hybrids has been his sustaining interest, he is also actively creating new Paphiopedilum and Aussie Dendrobium hybrids plus some others to be named if they work out! His pioneering work in Catasetum intergeneric hybrids led to the development of several notable hybrids, most recently the grex, Fredclarkeara After Dark, which produced "the blackest flower ever witnessed". This grex has received over 100 awards worldwide with nine FCC's and thirty AM's from the AOS judges!

Fred is an Accredited Judge in the Pacific South Judging Region. His plants have received hundreds of quality awards from the American Orchid Society.

ORCHID GEMS – ABBY WARHOLA

Abby Warhola: Seeing beauty and bringing it to the world

"Everything has beauty, but not everyone sees it."— Confucius



Abby Warhola, this month's highly gifted Gem, only recently joined the OSWP, however, her artistic contributions and generosity of spirit will definitely have a long impact. For one thing, she voluntarily designed our upcoming 2024 OSWP Show Poster which is so lovely that the Show Chairs and OSWP Board have agreed to reprint it on t- shirts that will be available for general purchase. "Abby is a caring and diligent worker and a charming, dedicated new member, who has been an immense help to me," says show co-chair Janet Greenberg. "Abby was willing to share her knowledge and I am so grateful."

Abby's the owner of AW Studio, a modern portrait studio located on Camp Horne Road that showcases highly compelling portraits that can be used for commercial branding as well personal and family pictures (<u>https://www.theawstudio.com</u>). And we should not be surprised by this career choice: Abby comes a "super artistic" family going back generations. Art is deeply embedded in the family. Her grandfather Paul Warhola, the oldest of three brothers, was in the scrap metal and recycling business. His eye for beauty, however, prompted him to collect some items. After his retirement, Paul also began to do abstract paintings (rather remarkably using chicken's feet rather than a paint brush). Paul's son, James Warhola, is a wellrecognized painter and illustrator of science fiction and children's books. And then there's the family giant, Paul's younger brother: famed Pop artist, silkscreen painter of soup cans and other objects of everyday life and photographer, Andy Warhol, who is Abby's greatuncle.

"I grew up surrounded by art, portraits and films" recalls Abby, "I really didn't know anything else." She recalls being captivated by Andy's black and white photos, and began to seriously pursue photography at the age of 13.

"I really loved photography. I thought it was great." Her

early supporters included her grandfather and her uncle James who not only offered encouragement but also gifted her with darkroom equipment. Abby also participated in a free



afterschool program on photography offered by the Manchester Craftsmen's Guild. "They would lend us cameras, give us film, and I had complete access to their wonderful darkroom."

Abby characterizes herself as self-taught." I was always told that I

had good art instincts, but I really wasn't' thinking of it as a career and so I started out by studying interior design as my college major." However, her parallel interests also included photography and ballet.

Abby's early career took her to New York where she made a name for herself photographing some of the most highly recognized names in the fashion industry. However, it was Covid and the need to settle into an established work environment that prompted her to return to Pittsburgh. She and her daughter, who studies ballet at Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre, live in Upper Schenley Heights.



And now for the orchids. Abby began to collect orchids just a few years ago. She started collecting orchids in a casual manner, picking up a few "rehabs" from Aldi at first. "The orchid that started my current orchid collection

was broken and was on clearance for \$3.25, and that one orchid has bloomed so many times for me. The grocery store Phals are low maintenance and add much life and beauty, especially in the dark days of the Pittsburgh winter."

So Abby's collection is small, spontaneous and based on a hunger to add to her home's beauty. She has about 35 plants including several phalaenopsis, a phragmipedium and some paphs, a miniature Vanda (Acineta densa), and a Dendrobium, but the largest number are oncidiums, among them many Twinkles. "They smell wonderful and can fill the room with fragrance, like vanilla. I like the Twinkles because they are tiny little things. I don't stake my orchids as I love how they fall naturally, the long sprays droop with so many blooms." She is now considering that she might concentrate on acquiring fragrant plants.



Abby joined OSWP

at our March 2022 spring show. "I went to the show with that specific Aldi Orchid and purposely brought it in for repotting." And what prompted her to join? "I was member of the mushroom club and really enjoyed their lectures. I had quite a few orchids at the time and I just figured that I should start learning more about them. The OSWP membership price was so reasonable, how could I not?"

And although she has only gone to a few meetings, she has spent numerous hours volunteering with us by designing and modifying the new, absolutely gorgeous show poster. So why do we grow orchids? Abby's answers reveal that there many reasons. For some, it's the challenge of growing orchids with different cultural requirements. For others, it's the obsessive feeding of an acute orchid addiction. For Abby, it's the incalculable fact of having another form of beauty in her space. However, her spatial limitations and time constraints have imposed limits. "I need my houseplants to live within my space with me, I don't want anything that needs special lights or humidifiers. They live where the natural light is, on window sills and counter tops, and they have taken over the dining room table. I'm pretty much maxed out."

So orchids can be for everyone, and there is no "one" way or a single path. But for this creator and lover of all things that can be considered art, the answer is selfexplanatory: beauty and joy.

Orchid Society of Western Pennsylvania (OSWP) General Meeting Nov. 12, 2023

The meeting was held at The Spartan Community Center of Hazelwood. There was no mini-class at the November meeting.

The business portion of the general membership meeting was called to order at approx. 2:00 pm by Vice President Carolyn Bolton.

The meeting began with an update from the Spring Show Committee (Sheila Nathanson, Norma Raiff and Janet Greenberg) regarding the preparations for the 2024 Spring Show.

- Demetria Marsh has agreed to Chair the Publicity Committee, thus relinquishing her role as Chair of the Helpers. A new Chair for the Helpers is now needed.
- The role of Hospitality Chair(s) has been filled by new members Aaron Goldman and Sherri Kinoshita (thank you to Mike Lysy for his many years of serving as Hospitality Chair!).
- Brian Powell is working on branding handouts that will include the new OSWP logo which can be used when seeking out new Sponsors for the Show. Members are encouraged to consider who they might be able to contact for sponsorship opportunities.
- Dave Motak is headlining the preparation of a Selfie backdrop that can be used by Show attendees.
