

Orchid Gems; Marion Wike

Sixty Years of Orchid Fever

I had the distinction of interviewing long-time OSWP member Marion Wike. Having joined OSWP in the mid-60s, Marion has been associated with OSWP longer than any other current member.

Marion, you have been an orchidist for 60 years. How did you get the fever?

"My neighbors invited me to go to an orchid sale in Ohio, but I was the only one of us who bought an orchid. I got the fever that day. Of course, initially, I made all of the mistakes a novice orchidist makes. I killed my first orchid by planting it in soil. It's a common mistake. Experienced orchidists don't do this. There are exceptions to every rule, however. I have a neighbor who has successfully grown an orchid in soil for the past five years.

In the long-run, I have learned that you can't tell anyone how to do anything. The smart ones know the conditions for their orchids."

How did you get involved with OSWP?

"I had approached someone at Phipps Conservatory about purchasing an orchid. He suggested that I join OSWP. The Society met at Phipps in the mid-60s. OSWP was a small group of around 40 members, with only half of those really active. I have tried to get in touch with some of those old members, but I have not been successful. The sixties were a long time ago, so I suppose many of them have passed on. Carolyn Bolton joined sometime after I did. She was a novice grower like me. It's hard to believe how far we've come since.

I continued my membership and was even Vice President of the Society in 1974. I had a greenhouse in Fox Chapel, but then my husband and I moved to Pinehurst, North Carolina in 1975."

Did you continue to pursue orchid collecting in Pinehurst?

"My husband and I were both golfers. That was what drew us to Pinehurst. It was a perfect place to garden and grow orchids. The growing season was nine months long and you could meet any plant's growing requirements. I had a greenhouse there for 38 years. There was plenty of sunshine. So much that I had to protect my orchids. My husband was very handy and could build anything, so he made me a nice shadehouse for use in the summertime.

I love the outdoors. We had three lots – about two acres. I covered them with flowering plants, particularly perennials because they return year after year.

I still love the outdoors. I'm the chairman of the landscaping committee at Gateway Towers. There are only four people on this committee, but that is the way we like it. Otherwise you have too many opinions, and nothing gets done. I was pleasantly surprised to be included on the committee and even more so to be appointed chairman. I enjoy it. I love spending Gateway Towers' money to make the place beautiful, and we certainly have a lot of fun. Of course we don't do the handiwork ourselves; we just plan, spend the money, and take the credit. A company does the hard part of mowing, landscaping, and planting."

You've been an orchidist for a very long time. Do you have some memories to share?

"It was a different world in the mid-60s. There weren't many orchid growers, but most of them were quite good (not the one we visited in Ohio). At that time, an orchid hobbyist could get an import license. I imported orchids from India and South America, and killed most of them.

I like to do something that no one else does. Orchids were dirt-cheap to buy and ship back then. I had a beautiful Coelognye-Pandurata. The blooms were six or seven inches across: Green and black, and shaped

like a violin. It was a rare and exquisite plant.

How about now?

"Cymbidiums are special to me. They love being moved to the deck in summer. Years ago, one of my Cymbidiums won First-In-Show at OSWP.

I love Cattleyas. So colorful: Red, yellow, and green. Unfortunately, in this phase of my life, I have to restrict myself to mini-Cats. The blossoms might be smaller, but I still love them. They are easier to carry; the large Cattleyas are just too heavy to move. So, even though I love the large Cats, they are too impractical for me to keep.

When I started growing orchids, I began with two plants. Then my collection rose to four hundred. Now I'm down to fifty. I have learned that only certain orchids work. It took me a long time to accept that.

As I mentioned earlier, I love to try something different. If someone suggests something interesting, I go for it. As a result, I have stacks of old OSWP bulletins filled with tips. Of course not all of the suggestions I followed were successful.

As an experiment, I grew hydroponic orchids and vegetables. I bought supplies online. I use those round clay pellets for medium. I had my doubts about the process, but now I have a sheath on an orchid. I was considering bringing it to the Orchid Show just because it's hydroponic and different. Admittedly, the hydroponic vegetables are doing better than the hydroponic orchids.

I used to use expanded shale as medium, and I liked it because water drains right through and doesn't collect. I didn't have to change medium, and I didn't have to worry about breakdown or root-rot. I would use it again in a minute if I could find a place to put it."

Marion, it seems that you have a great love of life. Do you have any advice for people?

"For a good and happy life, enjoy nature. Anyone who doesn't loses a lot. There is so much to look at and appreciate."

We will have a panel of OSWP members that have combined 80+ years of experience growing orchids. They will discuss their orchid growing experiences briefly then we will open up the meeting to review your questions. Perhaps you bought a new orchid at the OSWP March show and need to know a bit more information about the orchid and growing conditions... or perhaps you have had an orchid for several years that has not bloomed for you in a long time (or ever... don't worry... that happens). Perhaps you want more general information such as identifying where you can find terrestrial orchids on a hike in PA or how to safely place your orchids outside in summer... We will have a software product available called "Orchid Wiz" to look up information on specific orchids so if you have a question on a specific orchid, please remember to bring or take a clear picture of the label/tag in your orchid. The Distinguished Panel – Our current OSWP president, Demetria Marsh, whom has been growing orchids for over 40 years and she is still learning. She has grown in greenhouses, plant rooms, under lights, outside and now on windowsills. She has grown all types of orchids and is still learning about new species, hybrids and cultural tips.

The Orchid Manager of the award winning orchid collection at Phipps Conservatory (and OSWP member), Katie Schuller, who you may remember gave a great talk at our February 17th meeting on Stanhopea orchids. Katie has worked in the Victorian glasshouse in Oakland (Phipps) for three years. She has been taking such great care of the orchids at Phipps and will tell you that she has performed an abundant amount of research on the internet!

My Co-Vice President and longtime orchid grower, Timothy Choltco, whom has been growing orchids for 36 years and has been a member of the society since he was in his teens.
