# Orchid Gems – Hands on for a Sustainable Environment: Gary Worthington

You might remember recent news from Phipps that one of their orchids -- Paphiopedilum gratrixianum 'Phipps Best' -- was awarded a CCE/AOS of 91 points at the AOS judging in Ann Arbor, Michigan. This was a culmination of effort from Phipps horticulturalists and Society members who have helped to grow the Phipps' orchid collection through the years. The winning orchid was nurtured by Gary Worthington, the horticulturalist who replaced Katie Schuller as Phipps Orchid Manager. Taking on orchids was just another opportunity for Gary. During his five years at Phipps, he maintained the Center for Sustainable Landscapes, a 2-acre native planting, as well as the rooftop garden. "It's always a challenge



keeping a rooftop garden looking nice without constantly watering," Gary says. Gary left Phipps earlier this year to take the position of Maintenance Account Manager for Eichenlaub, Inc., a premier landscaping company. The orchid collection at Phipps remains in good hands with Giovanni Geraldo, who holds a PhD in botany and has a large orchid collection of his own. As Maintenance Account Manager for Eichenlaub, Gary supervises the crew, and oversees the design, construction, and maintenance of landscaping projects at client sites, ensuring that the ultimate plans of the landscape design are realized. During my conversation with Gary for this "Orchid Gems," I was immediately aware of his broad perspective when it comes to the outdoors. Like many of us, Gary can look back on his college years as a strong foundation and starting-point. A native of Meadville, Pennsylvania, Gary shed his hometown roots after high school and spent a year studying sustainability at Arizona State University. He then decided he would prefer to go to a smaller school with a more personal feel. Returning to Meadville, Gary was induced by his friends to attend nearby Allegheny College, where he majored in Environmental Science. This field of study was well-suited for Gary. The curriculum of the Environmental Science and Sustainability department centered around the concept of sustainable agriculture, and included studies in integrated pest management (IPM), plant science, and soil science. Over the years, Allegheny College has gained a reputation within Phipps for producing excellent horticulturalists.

Moreover, the school's mission of providing students with a well-rounded education induced Gary to explore different disciplines. He has a double major in Psychology and a minor area in Values, Ethics, and Social Action. Following college, Gary spent two years at Bongard Nursery & Landscaping in Jupiter, Florida. While he was there, he was able to experience the whole gamut of nursery management and plant maintenance, from customer sales and consultations to the care of nursery stock and propagation of tropical plants. "The owners allowed experimentation and gave me a lot of leeway. My time there can almost be called an internship. I'm still very close with them, and we remain friends," Gary remarks.

Hoping to repeat that positive experience in the state of California, Gary worked for Bay Maples Wild California Gardens, a water-wise landscaping company that specialized in rainwater retention and stormwater management. However, family matters forced Gary and his wife Chrissy, a native of Vandergrift, to return to western Pennsylvania.

With his experience at Bongard Nursery and Bay Maples, Gary had the perfect segue into his position as horticulturalist at Phipps Conservatory, where his experience with tropical plants, stormwater management, and sustainability was a good fit. There, he expanded his knowledge of tropical plants, networked with nurseries, and developed an appreciation for the native plants of Pennsylvania. As Maintenance Account Manager at Eichenlaub, Gary has an opportunity to broaden his scope. There is a lot to consider. At a client's site in Fox Chapel, for example, he might be called upon to come up with a solution for stormwater, which not only washes soil and mulch off property, but pollutes waterways as well. Gary practices sustainable landscaping, and this includes selecting the correct plants for the environment. Some landscapers, for example, might be tempted to select invasive plants because they are easy to grow. Gary, however, is careful to consider the environmental, as well as the aesthetic, impact of his designs and decisions.

While at Phipps, Gary had an opportunity to meet and work with members of the OSWP. Following Katie Schuller as Orchid Manager, Gary found it only natural to become a member of the Society. "I had some experience growing orchids, and I thought I was good at it.

"But I didn't join only for the orchids; I wanted to be around people who shared my enthusiasm for plants." Gary has ten orchids, and is hoping to create more space around his home to expand his collection. He is particularly fond of the spring-blooming Dendrobium nobile, and Dendrobium lindleyanum in particular, which handles winter and cold better than other varieties.

"I am confident that I can grow orchids at home, but I think it is important to remember that most of us are not growing in a greenhouse environment. Outside a greenhouse setting, growing entails struggling against difficult conditions, much different from those in Phipps Conservatory.

"Too many growers beat themselves up for their failures when they're setting their expectations too high. There is no need to do that. This is why it is important to select plants that suit your environment." Being outdoors and working with his hands is the ideal life for Gary. He loves to hunt and fish, and he and Chrissy are scuba divers who plan their vacations around the sport. They look forward to the warm months, so they can go boating with their friends and family on Conneaut Lake, Lake Erie, and the Allegheny Reservoir. A handyman like his father, Gary loves cars and trucks. He has built the engine of his old pickup truck from the ground up, as comfortable with working with his hands indoors as he is outdoors. Gary and his wife Chrissy live in New Kensington.

#### AOS Award Winners at 2022 OSWP Show Congratulations to all winners this year.

We had a very productive show this year with almost twenty-five plants and exhibits evaluated for AOS awards.

AOS Show Trophy is given to the best overall exhibit based on appearance, arrangement and quality of plants. The show trophy ballot is comprised of a maximum of 100 points divided into the categories of Appearance, Plant Quality, Plant Variety, and Labeling. Our winner was OSWP Exhibit 'The Joy of Orchids" ST-85.

AOS Silver Certificate Award is given to any exhibit achieving 85 or more points in the AOS Show Trophy balloting. The OSWP Exhibit was awarded the SC-85.

Orchid Digest Exhibit Trophy is awarded separately by a vote of participating judges to any participating amateur exhibit. This year's winner was OSWP Exhibit.

AOS Flower Quality Awards are given to plants of distinguished flower quality and of very good plant quality. Judging is based on a 100-point scoresheet and the resulting award is based on the average points scored with the high and low scores no more than six points range. HCC (Highly Commended Certificate) 75-79 pts, AM (Award of Merit) 80-89 pts. and FCC (First Class Certificate) 90-100 pts. are the categories. All divisions, progeny, and mericlones of these plants must carry this designation on each plant.

AOS Cultural Awards are given to growers of plants of exceptional quality for their type, genus, and species/hybrid. Judging is based on a 100-point scoresheet and the resulting award is based on the average points scored with the high and low scores no more than six points range. CCM (Certificate of Cultural Merit) 80-89 pts and CCE (Certificate of Cultural Excellence) 90-100 pts. are the categories. Unlike quality awards, cultural awards are given to the plant grower and not the plant so divisions, progeny, and mericlones should not carry this designation.

JC (Judges Commendation) is an award that covers a myriad of topics from exhibits to plants. It is awarded based on a 75% consensus vote of the judging team members.

Both received AM's, Awards of Merit, at that show.

# April Speaker Carri Raven-Riemann

Our Speaker for our April meeting will be Carri Raven-Riemann. Carri has a long history in the orchid world, including being a founder in 1990 of the International Phalaenopsis Alliance, Inc., serving 20 years on the Board of Directors of the Greater New York Orchid Society and as a member of a number of the American Orchid Society committees, including the Education Committee, Membership Committee & the Public Relations Committee. She became an Accredited American Orchid Society Judge in 1998. Beginning in 2007, she has traveled to Taiwan each year to serve as an AOS Judge for their annual Taiwan International Orchid Show (TIOS)

Carri's involvement with orchids began over 40 years ago with her first Phalaenopsis orchid ~ a hobby that quickly got out of hand! At last count her collection numbered in the thousands, ranging from very young plants to orchids in full bloom.

As a "boutique" commercial grower for 37 years, Carri focuses her orchid business, the orchidPhile, on being able to offer her clients the newest in cutting-edge Phalaenopsis species and hybrids in addition to other orchid genera which grow happily under the same conditions as Phalaenopsis. Of increasing importance to her clients is vivid color, heavy substance flowers that will provide them with long-lasting displays, fragrance and multitudes of flowers with more compact growth and spike habits. In the last two years she has also seen Taiwan's increased interest in breeding some new & more unique intergeneric hybrids utilizing Phalaenopsis as one parent

Carri's talk, "Phal. Species: From Mega to Micro", will focus on the most readily grown Phal. species, their habitat, & then translating that to what their cultural needs are when grown "in captivity", which also provides helpful cultural guidelines when some of these species are in the close breeding background of today's modern classic & novelty Phalaenopsis hybrids.
